So, before we officially say goodbye to 2023, I would like to share with you just a small glimpse at what this year has looked like for the New York Council Navy League.

At the core of our mission are the men and women, and their families, who serve our nation's Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard and U.S.-flag Merchant Marine. Throughout the past year, we continued to support our beneficiaries in ways both big and small.





2023 brought the long-awaited commissioning of USS Cooperstown (LCS 23). In partnership with the National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum, we welcomed the Freedom-class littoral combat ship, named in honor of the 70 Hall of Famers who served our nation during war time, to the fleet. With a week's worth of events, culminating in a Commissioning Ceremony on Saturday, May 6, we were honored to give the crew the celebration they deserved.





Just a few weeks after saying goodbye to the crew of USS Cooperstown, we said hello to the Sailors, Marines and Coastguardsmen who joined us for another successful Fleet Week New York. Thanks to the generosity of our friends at RxR Realty, Council volunteers got to welcome visiting sea service members and their families at our first Fleet Week Pop-Up. Every day throughout the week, right in the heart of Times Square, we provided service members with a chance to win prizes, enjoy some snacks and have a space to rest between activities. From new initiatives like the Pop-Up to the return of fan-favorite events like the Richard & Doris Scheuing CO/XO Welcome Reception, this year's Fleet Week was certainly one for the books.

We continued the necessary work to educate our members and the general public on the importance of our sea services. We hosted insightful National Security Briefings where guests had the opportunity to hear from expert speakers from the Council on Foreign Relations, the commander of the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve, the Journal of Commerce and the Navy League's Center for Maritime Strategy. We also had the distinct privilege to celebrate 50 Years of Female Naval Aviation at a dinner with VADM Shoshana Chatfield, USN and CAPT Joellen Drag Oslund, USN (Ret.), who earned her "Wings of Gold" in 1974 as the U.S. Navy's first female helicopter pilot.







After a successful inaugural conference in 2022, we once again gathered government officials, military leaders and maritime industry professionals to explore the vital role of the maritime industry at our New York Maritime Security Conference. Hosted at John Jay College of Criminal Justice, this year's conference focused on the navigation



of global commerce and conflict. In addition to our large roster of expert speakers and panelists, we had the honor to be joined by Congressman Jerry Nadler and MARAD Administrator Ann Phillips to present Congressional Gold Medal replicas to two World War II Merchant Mariners, Hugh Stephens and James Dipelesi. Also, ADM Linda Fagan, Commandant of the US Coast Guard joined us again to close out the conference and Federal Maritime Commissioner Carl Benzel also joined us again, this time as a panel moderator. I also appreciate the continued support of our partners in this endeavor – the American Maritime Congress and the Transportation Institute.

















The Navy JROTC Cadets, U.S. Naval Sea Cadets and Young Marines who make up our supported youth units are always a particular point of pride for our Council, and this year has been no exception. We had the opportunity to present almost 40 graduation stipends and year-end awards to highly deserving students, including two class valedictorians. Our youth units continued to be present at Council events as our color guard, award presenters and volunteers, and they were continuously active within their schools and communities.

In August, we took an extra step to connect with our students, wanting to make sure incoming freshman knew that the New York Council would be there to support them. With generous donations from our partners, members and friends, including SUNY Maritime College, we packed 625 Back-to-School kits for all nine of our supported youth units, which included school supplies to help students start the school year off on the right foot.



In November, we hosted our 121st Anniversary Dinner at The Plaza Hotel, in which we had the honor of recognizing those who have contributed to our great country. We initiated a new award, the Maritime Service Award, focusing on the contributions of the U.S.-flag Merchant Marine and the maritime industry to our national

security. Our first honorees were VADM Joanna Nunan, USMS, Superintendent of the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy and RADM Michael Alfultis, USMS, President of SUNY Maritime College. We had the distinct privilege of presenting this year's RADM J. Robert Lunny Patriot's Award to a true American hero, Col. Jack Jacobs, US Army (Ret.), a Medal of Honor recipient for service in Viet Nam. We also honored Tom Higgins of Fiserv, a long-time supporter of the New York Council and the Navy League. In addition, we had a highly successful paddle raise and auction, raising nearly \$45,000 in additional funds.
